





















## Garbage Collection Calendar

Classification	Garbage Collection Days	Examples of Garbage (How to Dispose of Garbage)	Points to Note When Disposing of Garbage
Burnable Garbage	<b>Every Week</b> <b>Tuesday</b> <b>Friday</b>	Food waste • Waste paper Plastics • Plants (less than 20 kg) Leather items • Cigarette butts CDs • Videotapes Futon (single size and smaller) Rubber products • Bath products Plastic toys etc	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Put garbage in a transparent or white semi transparent plastic bag.</li> <li>• Tie up the top of the bag.</li> <li>• (Any semi transparent plastic bag other than white is not accepted.)</li> <li>• If it is planned that by the end of March 2022, it will be decided that only designated bags will be collected.</li> <li>• Drain the food waste thoroughly.</li> <li>• Soak cooking oil in paper, cloth or harden it with a coagulant.</li> <li>• Soak unused fireworks and matches in water before disposing them.</li> <li>• Remove feces from disposable diapers.</li> <li>• If the futon does not fit in the bag, fold it one by one and tie it with a string. (Please separate double size and larger waste into oversized garbage.)</li> <li>• When disposing of plants, cut them to a thickness of 5 cm or less and a length of 60 cm or less.</li> <li>• Tie up the things that do not fit in the bag with a string.</li> </ul>
		Fluorescent tube (straight tube type round tube type light bulb type etc.) Mercury lamp bulb Incandescent light bulb Night light bulb Glow starter	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Put waste in the designated container of about 50 liters. Items put in any other containers will not be collected.</li> <li>• Remove the packaging.</li> <li>• Put waste in the designated container to make sure it will not crack. Put broken items in a transparent bag.</li> </ul>
Dry Batteries Mercury Thermometers	<b>First Monday</b>	Dry batteries • Micro cells Rechargeable batteries Portable secondary batteries Mercury thermometers	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Put waste in separate designated containers as shown on the left.</li> <li>• Make sure not to break the mercury thermometer while disposing. Put broken items in a transparent bag.</li> <li>• Disposable lighters must be emptied before disposing.</li> <li>• The city also carries out base collection (collection using the designated box for residents).</li> </ul>
Disposable Lighters		Disposable lighters Multipurpose lighters	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Put waste in the designated container of about 50 liters. Items put in other containers will not be collected.</li> <li>• Remove dirt before disposing.</li> </ul>
Glass Ceramics	<b>Even-numbered Months</b> <b>First Monday</b>	Flat glass Tempered glass Heat-resistant glass Mirrors Crockery • Ceramics	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Put waste in the designated container of about 50 liters. Items put in other containers will not be collected.</li> <li>• Remove dirt before disposing.</li> </ul>
Other Bottles	<b>Every Month</b> <b>Second Monday</b>	Glass bottles other than colorless Brown ones (blue • green • black • other colors) Including ones with light color such as wine bottles.	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Put waste in the designated container of about 50 liters. Items put in other containers will not be collected.</li> <li>• Empty the bottle and wash it with water.</li> <li>• Remove the cap and separate it.</li> <li>• If the labels are easy to peel off, then please do so.</li> <li>• Do not put broken bottles in a bag, but place them with bottles of the same category.</li> <li>• Separate pesticide bottles into cans and metals.</li> <li>• Color-code the items even if you bring them into the Kasumidai Clean Center Mirai.</li> </ul>
Colorless Glass Bottles	<b>Every Month</b> <b>Third Monday</b>	Colorless and transparent glass bottles (colorless 1.8 liter bottles milk bottles bottles for bottling, etc.)	
Brown Glass Bottles	<b>Every Month</b> <b>Fourth Monday</b>	Brown glass bottles (energy drink bottles, beer bottles, etc)	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Distinguish glass bottles by the color of the tip, and separate them into colorless, brown, and other colors.</li> <li>• Classify bottles colored with paint into other bottles.</li> </ul>
Cans Metals	<b>Every Month</b> <b>First Third Fifth Thursday</b>	Cans • Aluminum foil Small home appliances Cookware and tools (metallic) Spray cans Cassette gas cylinder Small scrap metal LED bulbs	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Put waste in the designated container of about 50 liters and make sure it does not stick out. Items put in other containers will not be collected.</li> <li>• Empty the inside of the cans.</li> <li>• Remove the cassette gas cylinder from the cassette stove.</li> <li>• For gas cans and spray cans, drain out the gas and make holes.</li> <li>• Wrap with tape or put sharp objects in a steel can before disposing.</li> <li>• Remove dry batteries and separate them into the designated containers.</li> <li>• Separate small household appliances that protrude from the designated container. Dispose them on the oversized waste day.</li> </ul>
Plastic Bottles	<b>Every Month</b> <b>First Third Fifth Wednesday</b>	 Things with This Mark A plastic bottle that has a depression at the bottom.	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Put waste in the designated container of about 50 liters and make sure it does not stick out. Items not in the designated containers will not be collected.</li> <li>• Rinse inside lightly with water, and crush flat.</li> <li>• Remove all caps and labels, dispose them on the burnable collection days.</li> </ul>
Magazines		Comic books Specialized magazines Novels • Study-aid books Dictionaries • Booklets etc	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Separately stack books, magazines and paper packages and tie the bundles in a cross with string.</li> <li>• Put "Other Paper Items" in a paper bag and tie them with string, tape them or fold one side to 50 cm or less and tie the bundles in a cross with string. (Remove the handles of the paper bags if they are not made of paper.)</li> <li>• Soaked and dirty paper, carbon paper and water resistant paper cannot be recycled, so dispose them on the burnable collection days.</li> </ul>

Recycled Cloth	 Examples of "Other Paper Items" Do not mix cardboard.	Used clothing Shirts • Trousers Sweaters • Underwear • Socks Sheets • Curtains Duvet cover	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Put them in a transparent plastic bag or tie the bundles in a cross with a string.</li> <li>• Do not stain it so that it can be reused.</li> <li>• Cloths containing cotton or sponge, or cloths that are soaking wet or dirty cannot be recycled, dispose them on the burnable collection days.</li> </ul>
Plastic Containers and Packaging	<b>Every Month</b> <b>Second Fourth Thursday</b>	 Things with This Mark Lunch boxes sold in convenience stores Cup noodles • Egg containers Shopping bags • Candy bags Shampoo • Detergent containers Formed polystyrene containers Plastic bottle caps • Labels etc.	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Put waste in a commercially available transparent plastic bag (not translucent).</li> <li>• If the items do not fit in the bag, bundle them with a string so that the items do not fall out.</li> <li>• Do not put things made of metal, etc.</li> <li>• Rinse inside and outside with water. If the dirt does not come off, dispose them on the burnable collection days.</li> </ul>
Newspapers Cardboard	<b>Every Month</b> <b>Fourth Wednesday</b>	Newspapers Flyers Single large sheets of paper Cardboard	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Bundle newspapers • flyers and single large sheets of paper separately tie the bundles in a cross with string, or put them in a designated paper bag distributed by a newspaper store.</li> <li>• After opening the cardboard, remove the staples and adhesive tape, fold it within 90 cm, tie the bundle in a cross with a string.</li> <li>• Soaked and dirty paper, carbon paper and water resistant paper cannot be recycled, so dispose them on the burnable collection days.</li> </ul>
Oversized Garbage		Small-sized furniture Chairs • Bicycles Umbrellas Electric fans • Heaters Big-sized toys etc	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Bring items with a length of 1.5 meters or more, or a weight of 20 kgs or more into Kasumidai Clean Center Mirai.</li> <li>• If there is a large amount of waste due to moving house or renovations, bring them into Kasumidai Clean Center Mirai.</li> <li>• Drain the fuel from heaters before disposing.</li> <li>• Bring batteries into Kasumidai Clean Center Mirai.</li> <li>• Remove dry batteries and dispose them into the designated container.</li> </ul>

### Reception Hours for Bring-in Garbage

Bring in related waste to Kasumidai Clean Center Mirai. Bring your ID with you.

**Monday to Saturday**  
**8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.**

If you bring in waste items by yourself, classify all the waste so that it can easily be taken out from the vehicle.

Kasumidai Clean Center Mirai is closed on Sundays and the year-end and New Year holidays (December 31st to January 3rd).

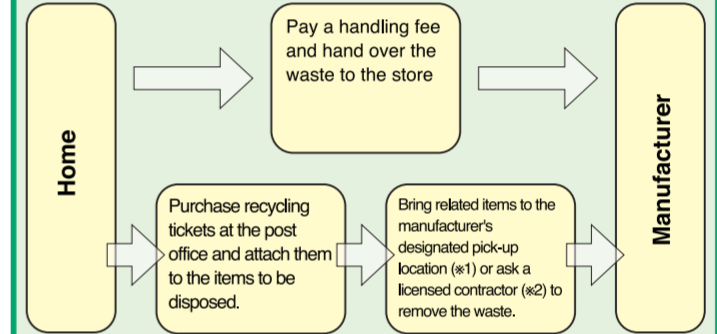
\*Dispose of garbage at the collection point by 8:00 a.m. on the designated day.

\*Garbage collection is not carried out during the year-end and New Year holidays. The city will inform you about the exact period in the Kasumigaura City public relations magazine and homepage.

\*Ask a licensed company or bring in your own business waste (require charge.)

### Air conditioners Televisions Refrigerators Freezers Washing machines Clothes dryers

According to the Home Appliance Recycling Law, the disposal of these items must be taken in the manufacturer's recycling process, so their disposal cannot be undertaken at Kasumidai Clean Center Mirai. Please follow the appropriate recycling instructions below.





Recycling tickets and transportation fees may vary depending on the type of product, manufacturer, carrier, etc.

### PCs

PCs that were sold after October 2003 have this mark. PCs with this mark can be collected with no charge.



- Call the section in charge of recycling of the manufacturer to ask about collecting your PC.
- Pack up the PC, stick the Yu-Pack slip that was sent from the manufacturer on the parcel, and ask the post office to arrange collection.

PC accessories including mice, keyboards, and cables will be collected as well when disposing of them along with PCs.

### Garbage that the City does not Handle

- Construction waste material  
Ask industrial waste professionals for disposal of waste.
- Construction debris • Blocks • Iron frames • Timbers etc  
Ask industrial waste professionals for disposal of waste.
- Rain gutters (made of plastic) • Corrugated levee sheets  
Ask industrial waste professionals for disposal of waste.
- Medical Waste  
Ask specialized professionals for disposal of waste.
- Gas cylinders • Fire extinguishers etc  
Ask retailers where you purchased them for disposal.
- Chemicals • Hazardous substances • Paint • Oils etc  
Ask retailers where you purchased them for disposal of waste.
- Tyres  
Ask retailers where you purchased them for disposal of waste.

Commercial Waste	200 yen per 10 kg
